WAYS TO BOOK AN APPOINTMENT

Receptionists will be required to ask the below information to be able to provide the best care:

- Patient Name/ DOB and/or Address/ Current Contact number
- Reason for the Call / Symptoms

Same day – we release the majority of our appointments on the same day as we believe this offers an outstanding service. These can be booked via telephone from 08:00 Monday to Friday. If we are fully booked and you think you need to be seen as an emergency/urgently please inform the reception staff and you will be seen as soon as deemed necessary by the doctor on call.

Pre-bookable – these are limited, but available to pre-book up to 2 weeks in advance, to allow us to offer more same day appointments. Please ask when the next pre-bookable appointment is.

Extended access –these appt are in the evening and weekends at external hubs within our PCN. These can be booked via telephone.

PATCHS- online triage tool for non-urgent issues. This is available online via our website Monday to Friday between 08.00-18.00.

Online booking – ask our reception team to set you up for online access (over 16 years of age only). <u>Ideal if you want to pre-book an appointment!</u> Available only for smear test at the moment.

111 / 111 Online - can help 24/7 to provide medical advice and assistance, when we are closed.

999 / A&E is available 24/7 for medical emergencies.

If you want to be seen by a certain doctor the waiting time may be longer.

In return we ask you to...

- Check the list below and overleaf to ensure you choose well.
- Cancel any appointments you cannot keep as early as possible so that the appointment can be made available to someone else.
- Request emergency or urgent appointments only when absolutely necessary
- Observe the 'one patient, one appointment' rule and do not compromise the Doctor/Nurse by asking him/her to treat other family members at the same time.
